

### **ESRC Digital Footprints: Strategic Advice Team Workshops**

SRC is inviting UK colleagues from all social science disciplines who utilise, plan to use, or have insights into digital footprint data to attend an online workshop on 7 March 2023 at 13:00hrs. The workshop series is part of the ESRC Digital Footprints: Strategic Advice Team project, which will allow the ESRC research community to contribute to the "research pillar" and "data centre" definitions for the forthcoming [Digital Footprints funding programme](#). This programme is an estimated £59.3 million investment in new research infrastructure for social sciences that will run between 2022 and 2029.

The Stein Rokkan Prize for Comparative Social Science Research, presented by the International Science Council together with the University of Bergen and the European Consortium for Political Research is awarded on an annual basis and comprises an award of EUR 5,000. ### Policy Update

This month we update in detail on recent developments regarding the proposed new Northern Ireland protocol and the implications this could have for UK science and researchers. It has been a major hurdle to the UK's accession to Horizon Europe funding and if passed will be good news for the people of Northern Ireland, as well as for scientific collaboration and UK researchers. We also update on the Labour Party's 2019 manifesto commitment to abolish tuition fees. There is significant uncertainty on what the final policy will be given current fiscal challenges. Finally we look at continuing pressures on university finances and related issues of foreign student numbers and student number caps.

### **Putting 'purpose' at the heart of business - Purposeful Company publishes two vital reports**

Last month the [Purposeful Company](#) co-chaired by Will Hutton FAcSS published two major reports which demonstrate how putting 'purpose' at the heart of business is the key to long term value creation and the pre-condition for sustained recovery. The two reports: '[Advancing Purpose](#)' and '[Private Equity and Purpose](#)' which have taken a year to complete, are the most extensive examination of investor and business opinion on purpose and ESG and their practice yet undertaken. There is widespread agreement from practitioners that purpose-led business best creates long term value for all stakeholders. However there is much to do to further the case - there are shortcomings in reporting , communicating, investor interest and uncertainty about
