Themes and Topics: We encourage papers and presentations, including work in progress or early ideas for discussion on themes including, but not limited to:

- Law and Social Justice: The role of legal frameworks in promoting social equity.
- Education and Social Justice: Innovative approaches to legal education that emphasise social justice.
- Access to Justice: Addressing barriers to legal representation for marginalised communities.
- Human Rights and Equity: Examining intersections of human rights law and social justice.
- Community Engagement and Legal Advocacy: Community-based approaches to legal support.
- Interdisciplinary Approaches: Collaborative efforts between legal studies, education, and social sciences.
- Ethics in Law and Education: Ethical implications of legal practice and education in advancing social justice.
- Private Law and Reform: Exploring private law reforms to integrate social justice considerations.
