
WOMEN SOLCITORS: TO TREAT THE SAME OR DIFFERENTLY?

Should female and male solicitors be treated the same? YES = equal treatment

BUT this does not produce equality of outcome:

For over 20 years, more than 50% of newly qualified solicitors have been female, but still approximately 80% of partners are male. Also there is a persistent pay gap problem between the sexes. The legal profession has a severely leaky pipeline for women, but not men.



Are men and women different? Is it fair to treat them differently?
