<p>3.1 Chair</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Welcome to new Members Jane Scoular (J Sc), Kevin Brown (KB) and Sarah Blandy (SB). • Seminar on Impact to proceed tomorrow and will include the Chair and a number of other members from the REF sub-panel for law. Thanks for administrative assistance from the LSE Law Department and the British Academy for accommodation. There was an excellent response and the event is fully booked. • JM attended an ESRC roadshow and noted an emphasis on funding the analysis of existing data sets in preference to the collection of new data; and bigger, in preference to smaller, projects. PE noted similar themes when she attended an AHRC roadshow, consistent with a push to encourage some universities to focus on research and others not to; along with a failure to discuss the controversy surrounding the AHRC's commitment of funding to research on the Big Society. • NJ, MS, JM and RH drafted a specification for work to the website, chose the most promising of the expressions of interest received. Concluded an agreement for upgrade to the current version of the Joomla content management system, fixing of glitches and training of relevant Executive Committee members within 4 weeks. Next steps will be to consider moving to a hosting package with the same supplier; and adding e-commerce functionality. • LM and RH had a very productive site visit to DMU. • Profit sharing arrangements for joint Honolulu conference still unclear. • The SLSA's current inability to contribute financially to the creation of the World Consortium of Law and Society (WCLS) has been communicated. There is a possibility that the SLSA will be able to be a 'friend' rather than a 'member'. • LH attended a Campaign for Social Sciences 	<p>RH APK MS</p>

The 25 year old campaign is seeking examples of news stories generated by socio-legal research to demonstrate the importance of the social sciences. They point out that collecting such stories is increasingly important for researchers in light of the Impact regime.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Thanks to the Academy of Social Sciences for providing free subscription for the year in light of our financial constraints. • RH has continued the tradition of consulting and sharing ideas with the Society of Legal Scholars and other subject associations. <p>AGREED:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In keeping with past practice, <i>Journal of Law and Society</i> has been invited to nominate a member of their Editorial Board to the SLSA Executive Committee to replace former Committee Member Joanne Hunt. • SLSA chair has been invited to attend the ESRC's annual meeting with learned societies. RH is unable to attend but will circulate the invitation to Executive Committee members and ask for a volunteer • In light of preference for large-scale funding mentioned above, SLSA will try to assist members who wish to find partners for funding applications. For example, Annual Conference calls can emphasise that panels, themes and streams might reveal potential funding co-applicants. • In a change to the decision of 19.05.11, to continue to hold three Executive Committee meetings per year, but to hold one on the Thursday afternoon at the end of the annual conference. Travel costs for Committee members would not be covered by the SLSA. • RH to continue to follow the progress of the WCLS and the possible role of the SLSA within it, and to discuss this with the new Scientific Director at Onati, Angela Melville, in due course. APK will look into the possibility of carrying the spirit of the WCLS forward by linking to the WCLS and other websites from the SLSA website. • MS to communicate with the Academy for Social Sciences press secretary, sending them our Newsletter, asking them for a contribution to the Newsletter.

<p>7. REF consultation on criteria and working methods*</p>	
<p>The paper drafted by RH was discussed. The following questions were identified:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Whether it is necessary for ‘users’ to agree with research in order for it to have ‘impact’ or whether a ‘user’ noting disagreement with a piece of research would also count? • How can the gulf between knowing or suspecting that a piece of research has been consulted by a user and proving that the research was the cause of change be bridged? <p>AGREED</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Working group to be created with APK, AB, VM, CA as members and RH to coordinate. • Response to consultation to be submitted by 05.10.11 • Co-authored pieces should be assessed within the usual criteria-- that is, if the contribution of an author is thought to be limited, that author should receive a low rating for it--no matter whether the authors are in the same or different institutions. To render co-authorship within the same institution risky, as the present criteria do, is to undermine the emphasis increasingly placed by funders on research centres, research groups and capacity building (see Agenda Item 3.1 above). • More guidance should be provided on when outputs will qualify for double weighting; and the only risk attached to an application for double weighting should be a low rating, not rejection. • HEFCE must redraft its policy on the effect of personal circumstances, including maternity, leave taking care to avoid discrimination against any group. 	<p>APK AB CA RH VM</p>
